- a) The college as a whole has 503 computers. All the computers are connected to a lease line internet having speed of 156 mbps. The college campus as a whole is secure Wi-Fi enabled with speed of 54 mbps along with 5 routers. Every student and staff member is provided a Wi-Fi connection on his/her laptops, tablet or smart phone.
- b) The Computer Science Department has adopted client-server technology with Dell Xeon 410 Server having 150 clients.
- c) Technical up-gradation of machines, software and anti-viruses of all the departments of senior college is maintained by the department of Computer Science. Some machines of E-Library and other departments are maintained by Hardware Academy of Azam Campus under an Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) and the contract is renewed every year.
- d) The college has adopted the ERP software Vriddhhi. Thus teachers and students can communicate and exchange notes and feedback through this ERP software. This software also helps in smooth and easy Online Admissions. Time tables and upcoming events are also displayed through this software. Teachers can maintain their daily teaching plan using the E-teacher diary provided by the software.

The college conducts the Central Assessment Program for all First Year undergraduate examinations. The college declares the First Year results within 30 days of holding the examinations.

The University has introduced the credit system for all P.G courses. Under the credit system, 50% of the marks are for internal assessment. This assessment can be done in a variety of ways, such as presentations, assignments, tests, group work etc. Thus the University is moving from an examination system that gives marks for memory to an examination system that evaluates the actual learning of the students.

6.10 What efforts are made by the University to promote autonomy in the affiliated/constituent colleges?

1. Title of the Practice:

Popularization of Use of Computers and ICT

2. Goal:

To add quality in the teaching and learning process through implementation of ICT methods.

3. The Context:

A picture is worth a thousand words. Use of graphical images, animations, videos of demonstrations and video lectures by eminent professors plays an important role in clearing various concepts. Online resources are a very rich source of information with graphical explanations which are missing from the regular text books.

4. The Practice:

Teachers use ICT during their lectures through the use of power point presentations, GIF animations, Shock Wave Flash animations, explanatory notes with images, on line research papers etc. All Departments have portable LCD projectors which are used almost every day. In addition, the college has developed two smart class rooms with interactive boards and short throw LCD projectors. Digital camera is also used to show the images from books, slides on the projector. The college has a two fully equipped multimedia rooms and computer labs with LCD projectors which too are used by the faculty members.

5. Evidence of Success:

Students at under graduate and post graduate level are equally comfortable with the use of these ICT methods. They present class room seminars, which they prepare by using online resources under the guidance of their teachers. The presentation of seminar is made on LCD projectors which is mandatory for each student at PG Level. The students also submit e-assignments. Students also present their project work on LCD projectors during practical examinations.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources:

Some traditional language departments and some senior teachers do not use this facility to an optimum level. As the main thrust of the Parent Body is 'growth with latest technology'; resources for purchase and maintenance of Computers and other Information and Communication Technology is readily available.
