If yes, give a brief description and a list of modules currently operational (maximum 500 words)	<p>The college is a multifaculty institute catering to more than 5000 students through 33 undergraduate and postgraduate programs. Well designed computer based system for management of information is in place. Data is collected on several parameters such as teachers, student enrolment, programs, examination results, finance and infrastructure. All processes like admission, issue of ICard, application for eligibility and scholarships are managed by EAdministration office through a well designed and effective Management Information System. Online application for examination, examination fee and issue of hall tickets is facilitated by the examination section. Fully automated library uses OPAC system for book records. Library books are issued by barcode system. Teachers' data is maintained by Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system: Vridhhi. Feedback on Curriculum and teaching learning process is collected and analyzed online. Biometric attendance is in place for all the staff members. Feedback of this attendance is forwarded to each teacher, HOD and Principal at the end of the month. MOODLE has been implemented at PG level in the college. Daily diary is maintained by teachers for maintaining</p>

records of teaching learning Process. Tally software is used by Accounts Section, to keep the financial records of aided and unaided programs, salary and nonsalary grants. The IQAC updates the college website periodically by uploading the Academic Calendar, Policy Manuals, Reports and Photos of various events and other data pertaining to NAAC. MIS facilitates management of data and submission to College administration, Management, UGC, AISHE, DHEMHRD and SPPU.

### CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

#### 1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

**Appointment of Qualified Staff:** Staff members are appointed as per the norms defined by State Government, UGC and affiliating University. **Distribution of Workload:** UGC norms are followed for assignment of workload to staff members. The teachers are allotted the subjects based on the area of interest and expertise. **Academic Planning:** Department wise and faculty wise teaching and practical time table is prepared. Class room and laboratory time table ensures the smooth conduct of lectures and practicals. The time table is displayed on the various notice boards, for staff and students. **Learning Management System** Vridhdi is used to prepare semester wise Objective Driven Teaching Plan. **Teaching Methodology:** The teachers make maximum use of modern methods of teaching. Learning management systems like Vridhdi, Easy Class and MOODLE are used. These systems facilitate preparation of teaching plans, conducting tests, assignments, evaluating and computing marks for the same. Bridge courses are organized and conducted for the first year students and lateral entry students to help them understand basic concepts. **Co-curricular and Extra-Curricular Activities:** The departments organize a number of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, which are planned in advance and incorporated into the academic calendar. The activities include Class Room Seminars, Guest Lectures, Group Discussions, Workshops and Experiential Learning Activities that augment the teaching and learning process. Bridge and Remedial courses are conducted. **IQAC:** The IQAC has an intrinsic role to play in the implementation of curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities of all the departments. The academic calendar is compiled for the whole college inclusive of the above mentioned activities. IQAC has implemented a system to ensure syllabus completion through submission of syllabus completion reports at the end of each academic year. Staff's arrival and departure is scrutinized through biometric system in addition to monitoring of lectures and practicals.

### 1.4.2 – How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

#### Feedback Obtained

Process Feedback is taken to get the opinion of the students, alumni, parents, employers and teachers on the curriculum. The questionnaire was designed on parameters like the difficulty level, relevance, practical application and employability. The questionnaire was filled by all stakeholders including students, alumni, parents and employers. Feedback In addition to regular academics, the students suggested incorporation of more field visits, hands on experience and free electives to get an opportunity to learn interdisciplinary subjects. The alumni were satisfied with the curriculum offered by the university. They found that the special subjects introduced in the syllabus are relevant to their job profiles and helpful for their future aspirations. The curriculum offered was helpful in developing their personality, research capability. Parents strongly agreed that the curriculum of the university was well designed and focused on employability and helped in developing the personality of their wards. Some parents suggested that IT skills of students should be increased. The Employers felt that Curriculum helped them to get best Employees with updated Knowledge. Employers are satisfied with basic technical skills of the employees gained throughout the course in the college. Employers had given suggestions for improvement of skills beyond academics. Teachers are satisfied with the current curriculum including CBCS introduced by SPPU as it is completely relevant and focuses on skill enhancement of students with latest technology for the academic development and employability. Feedback Analysis The work of collecting and analysing the feedback was done by the respective departments. The suggestions were collected and studied systematically based on the above mentioned parameters. Relevant and pertinent suggestions on the curriculum were taken into consideration. This analysis is done in form of Graphical and subjective forms. Action Taken As the college is an affiliated college and all curriculum related matters are dealt with by the respective Board of Studies, the feedback is sent to the respective Board of Studies Chairmen of SPPU. These suggestions are taken into consideration during the

syllabus Revision and Restructuring Processes. Overall development of the institution The feedback analysis of all stakeholders is taken into consideration by the BOS of SPPU and by the institute. The suggestions sent to the BOS are considered by the Boards of Studies of the SPPU. Skill Based Courses: Based on suggestions in the feedback on the curriculum, the college has initiated 22 skill based certificate courses which enhance their hands on learning and employability. Placement: The placement has shown improvement. Progression to Higher Studies: There is also a trend to improve their qualifications by pursuing their masters leading to better career opportunities. Stronger and Active Alumni: This has given a voice to the Alumni in the process of syllabus restructuring.

### 2.3.2 – Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

The Mentoring process is systematic and methodical and is as follows: Mentoring Process: Details of Undergraduate and Post graduate students are collected through Know Your Students (KYS) form by the respective departments. The teachers identify the students during the lectures on the basis of their performance. The teacher takes a session of the identified students and tries to collect all the information like their interests, views, goals and future plans. Each teacher mentors up to five students. Regular meetings from time to time keep the teacher updated about the progress of student. Guidance is provided by the teacher as per the need of the student which helps them to overcome the weakness and convert them into strengths. Areas of Mentoring: The mentor lays a thrust on Holistic development. The teachers mentor students on the following aspects: Personal: Personal counselling includes advice on basic medical and psychological issues. Students having serious psychological issues like anxiety or depression problem are mentored and if needed directed to the Counseling cell. At times the students have family problems for which the student may be counselled with family members. Financial: a large number of students in the college come from economically weak backgrounds. The students are guided for many scholarships so that they can continue their studies without break. They are also encouraged to work in the Earn and Learn scheme of the SPPU. Academic: Academic mentoring includes educational and career planning. The student is advised to be regular in class and participate in co curricular and extracurricular activities to improve academic output. Students are encouraged to take part in various competitions at college and intercollegiate level. They are also guided about various coaching schemes and exams for the particular subjects or profession they are interested to take up in future. Lectures are conducted for students to give them information about different competitive examinations in their specialization, different career options, list of research institutes and companies where they can find jobs. Career: The students are also

asked about their career aspirations and the mentor discusses the pros and cons of the career choices and explains to the student which would be best suited to the student. The student is encouraged to go to job fairs and campus recruitment drives to improve chances of quick placements. Follow up: After the primary counselling the mentor discusses the goal set by the student, which is frequently reviewed. The mentoring helps the student in interpersonal relationships and helps in academic and career planning. Mentoring records are maintained by the respective teachers in the prescribed format. Follow up of the mentored students is taken where needed. The students are encouraged to work hard to understand their abilities and strengths and help them to succeed in life.

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#### 2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The college follows the examination pattern of the affiliating University. The CIE schedule is planned at the beginning of the year by each department and charted in the Academic calendar. At the Undergraduate level for Arts and Commerce, 80:20 pattern is followed. The internal assessment of termend is of 60 marks converted to 20 in final mark sheet. The examination and assessment is internal. The final examination is of 80 marks. For science faculty undergraduate level, 40:10 semester system is followed. First year examinations are internally assessed for all faculties. PostGraduate Level for all faculties follows Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). As per the guidelines of the affiliating University, 50 percent of the assessment is internal. The internal exams can be in the form of tests, assignments, open book exam, seminar, library work, multiple choice tests and Oral exam. This 50:50 assessment is semesterwise. In addition to regular internal exam, term end exam and annual exam the students are evaluated through Class Tests/Tutorials/Assignments/Presentations. In addition to the class tests, the assignments and project work is also assessed as a part of CIE.

#### 2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

Academic Calendar uploaded on institutional website includes CIE Schedule along with Curricular, Cocurricular and Extracurricular Activities. Every department submits the compliance of the academic calendar. In addition, the internal audit ensures that the compliance through verification of documentary evidence. The process is as follows: Teacher: Every teacher is assigned the subjects to be taught during the academic year. The teacher plans the teaching and evaluation schedule of assigned subject. The type and schedule of internal evaluation is planned in consultation with the head of the department. Head of the Department: The Head of the department compiles the academic plan submitted by the teachers and ensures that there is no overlapping of the activities in general and the CIE in particular at both the internal as well as the University level. The Academic calendar is then forwarded to the IQAC. IQAC: The IQAC compiles the inputs received from the various departments and a comprehensive plan is prepared and uploaded on the college website. Stakeholders: The stakeholders are aware of the CIE of every department in the college. The adjustment in dates is sometimes made subject to the examination schedule of the affiliating University. The students are informed accordingly through notices, announcements in the classroom, departmental blogs, college website and what's app messages.

A system is in place for Infrastructure development and maintenance of the
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entire campus. The college prepares and submits financial requirements to the management, which is approved by CDC. The management has constituted a repairs and maintenance committee. Campus upkeep is done through housekeeping department. Appointment of technicians for maintenance of hardware and software of IT infrastructure is done. Computers, printers and power backup is maintained through Annual Maintenance Contract. Procedures and policies: Sports complex: The college uses support facilities available with central sports academy through requisition for the same in advance, to the Director of the Sports Academy to ensure availability. Gymnasium: Gymnasium has modern equipment. It is available for use to all students free of cost. Timing for male and female students have been earmarked. Auditoriums: The society has provided a centrally located auditorium (400 capacity) opposite A. R. Shaikh Assembly and an open space auditorium (200 capacity) in the V. M. Gany Sports Complex. Class Rooms: The Classrooms are allotted as per the student strength and time table. Each ICT enabled classroom is assigned to one teacher for maintenance and upkeep. The college has a sufficient number of ventilated and spacious classrooms with computers and LCD Projectors. Two Smart classrooms are utilized for UG and PG Classes. Laboratories: 1. Laboratory sessions are allotted for classes based on timetable. 2. Standard Operational Procedures for equipment and instruments are strictly followed. 3. Dead Stock register is maintained and updated regularly and verified during academic audit. 4. Outdated equipment and instruments are discarded through standard procedure. Computer Laboratory: 1. Computer laboratories are allotted to different classes and faculty based on timetable. 2. ELibrary time table is made to ensure optimum utilization. 3. The department of Computer Science processes the requirements and maintains of all computers and peripherals. 4. All outdated and old computers and other e waste is disposed through Azam Campus Hardware academy. Library: 1. Every student procures a Library Card within a week of taking admission and can issue two books every week. 2. Every student can access online journals and magazines in the ELibrary. The E library is open to students from 7.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. 3. Students can access the books available on the college intranet server from any computer terminal in the college campus. 4. Students can use the central reading room from 8.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m. Utilization for Curricular and Cocurricular activities: There are 6 audiovisual rooms. The college has 3 auditoriums, namely, Green Auditorium (300 capacity), Pavilion Hall (200 capacity) and Antique Seminar Hall (120 capacity), PAI Hitech Hall (100 capacity) and one centrally located A. R. Shaikh Assembly hall (560 capacity) to conduct seminars, workshops, symposia and conferences.

## 6.1 – Institutional Vision and Leadership

**Practice I: Organization of National /International Conferences/Seminars** The college organizes Conferences and Seminars every Year. The University sponsors only a limited number of Seminars/ Conferences per college. In order that every department get an opportunity to organize the same the decision as to which department will organize the Seminars is taken in the first staff General meeting. Thus a chance is given to every department to organize the same.

**Planning and Execution:** Once it is decided which department will be organizing, full freedom is given to the department to chalk out the details, invite the speakers, receive the research papers, formulate the editorial board, invite academicians on to the editorial board and forward the Research Publication for printing. The department head and all the department teachers are given full authority to organize the Seminar/ Conference the way they want to. Innovation is encouraged. Periodic review meetings are taken with the Principal and IQAC and any additional resources financial or human required by the department are made available to them. It is the Head of the Organizing Department who is the Conference Secretary and his/ her consent is necessary on every decision.

**Outcome** Every year a minimum of three Seminars–One State Level, One National and One International Level are organized by the College. Further as the University also sponsors One State Level NET/ SET Workshop that too is organized by the college without fail.

**Practice II: System of Parallel Head for Internal Academic Audit** In order to ensure that all documentary evidence are being maintained by each department and best practices of each department are examined by peers this system was initiated. A list of parallel heads and checklist is made by IQAC each year. This check list is circulated to all teachers so that their inputs is taken before the same is finalised. This list of parallel heads is rotated so that each department gets an opportunity to visit every other department. Peer verification is done and best practices of each department are noted by the verifying head. Each head is given the opportunity to present a best practice that he/she noted of the parallel department at the term end meeting. Outcome The best practices of various departments are identified and the same are then institutionalized. The onus of identification is placed on every Head of Department. And the entire college selects the best practice to be institutionalized during the end of year staff meeting. ### 7.2 – Best Practices

**Best Practice I** 1. Title of the Practice: Admission in Minimum Time with Maximum Ease 2. Goal: To complete the admission process with maximum efficiency in a time bound manner 3. The Context: Facilitation of timely and hassle free online admission process in one visit to the college. The college provides facilities viz. display of step by step procedure of admission, 140 computers for online applications and supporting staff. Easy procedures for completion of admission process, issuing of Identity Card and Library Card with facility of on campus payment of admission fee through extension counter of bank. 4. The Practice: Abeda Inamdar Senior College of Arts, Science and Commerce is a minority education institution. Rules of reservation are not applicable hence 100 admissions are given to all minority communities in unaided sections. Unaided section of the college comprises 90 of student strength. Prescribed norms of statutory bodies are followed for admission to aided sections. The college gives admission on first come first serve basis irrespective of caste, class or category with a cut off of 50 for UG and PG Programs. The students are given admission as soon as they come to the college with a printout of the online admission form. Thus, a student can complete the entire process within one day and in one visit to the college. However a time period of three days is given to each student to complete the admission process, failing which the student loses his/her claim over the seat. Thus the college completes the entire admission process within one month from the date of opening of admissions. Generally, the affiliating university sanctions additional 1020 of intake capacity on application made by the college after 45 days of commencement of the admission process. Admissions are given under this additional quota on merit basis. The college has a center of the 'School of



Open Learning' of the SPPU for B.A, B.Com. M.A. and M.Com. Programs. Students securing less than 50 marks or students approaching after completion of admissions are guided to apply through the university's website at this center for admission. Thus, such students are also accommodated by the college. 5. Evidence of Success: This practice ensures those students who give a preference to the college for admission, can complete the admission with just one visit to the college. No student that approaches the college within 20 days of commencement of admission is left out from getting admission to the college and admission process is also completed within one month from date of commencement of admission. The procedure followed for 1020 additional quotas ensures that meritorious students who approach the college late for admission also get a fair chance of getting admission. The college has a Cosmopolitan Diaspora of students. 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: As such the college does not face any problem in practicing the above mentioned policies and procedures. Well trained and motivated teachers and support staff is needed for effective implementation. 7. The college also rewards the efforts of the students by distributing a large number of prizes for the various activities, thus building the confidence of the students. Further the college informs students about the availability of various scholarship schemes. The teachers have a poor fund to which each teacher contributes and the same is utilized to sponsor the education of some needy students. The management too sponsors the fees of needy students. The college runs three parallel earn and learn schemes, to accommodate the large number of students that apply for the same. As the students are first generation learners, the college has to involve the parents in their growth, progress and achievement. Student toppers are felicitated at the annual prize distribution function together with the parents. The parents are counselled to allow the student to complete her education and then get her married. Regular parents' teachers meetings are organized to inform the parent about the progress of the student. The entire college campus is Wi Fi enabled. All students are provided with free wifi on their mobile phones or tablets.
