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## **1. INTRODUCTION :**

Under autonomy, the college is implementing Choice Based Credit System at the Post Graduate Level under the Faculty of Arts. The P.G Degree Course (2023Pattern) will be introduced in the following order :

✓ M.A Part – I :2023 - 2024

✓ M.A Part – II :2024– 2025

- M.A Degree Course will consist of **Four Semesters** divided into **Two Years**.
- The first year will consist of Semester I and II and Second Year will consist of Semester III and IV.
- Semester End Examination ( SEE ) will be held at the end of each semester.

## **2. ELIGIBILITY:**

The student who has passed any Bachelor's degree from any recognized University shall be held eligible to take admission in the said course. For MA Psychology, preference will be given to graduates in psychology subject.

## **3. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:**

The medium of instruction for all the Arts PG courses will be English except Urdu specialization.

## **4. DURATION:**

- Post Graduate program will be of Two Years duration consisting of two parts. i.e. Part I and Part II. Each part is having two Semesters. Thus the M.A.Program is of FourSemesters. For each Semester, there will be Four Papers of 100 marks each.

## **5. Academic Bank Of Credits (ABC):**

The “Academic Bank of Credits” (ABC) is a notional level digital platform created to providestudents with increased flexibility and mobility in their educational pursuits, allowing them to accumulate and transfer academic credits across different programs and institutions.The Academic Bank of Credits will

facilitate multiple entries and multiple exits for students by storing student credits and transferring credit through a single window after approval of the source and destination academic institution.

Students should register for a unique ABC ID through the ABC platform (<https://www.abc.gov.in/>).

Through this platform students can log in to check their earned credits. Students are expected to follow the guidelines issued by the concerned authorities in this regard from time to time.

#### **6. TERM OF COURSE :**

- a. The existing relevant ordinance will be applicable i.e. N+2
- b. The maximum duration to complete the Masters of Arts Program will be ( N + 2 ), i.e ( 2+2) years to complete the M.A. Program.
- c. The student will have to take fresh admission if the student fails to complete the M.A. degree in 4 years.

#### **7. ATTENDANCE :**

Minimum 75% attendance is compulsory in each semester.

#### **8. COLLEGE TERMS :**

The dates for the commencement and conclusion of the first and the second terms shall be defined by the College Authorities. Only duly admitted students can keep the terms. The present relevant Ordinances pertaining to grant of terms will be applicable. Entry and exit of students will be decided as per Maharashtra State Government resolution and NEP guidelines (Reference: शासननिर्णयक्रमांक: एनईपी-2020/प्र.क्र.09/विशि-३/शिकाना))

#### **9. PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES & OUTCOMES:**

- The student will have inculcated skills to conduct independent Research in the Humanities.
- The student would make effective presentations combining visual communication with effective oral content.
- The student should be able to read texts and other media critically, to analyze evidence, arguments, and competing interpretations, and to challenge assumptions and values that are factually incorrect be it in the historical, social or political field.
- The student should be able to conduct minor research projects individually and in group work under time and resource constraints. They should be able to identify, explain and use concepts, theories, models and data analytic techniques
- The student should be able to articulate complex understandings of the processes of world events and policies in the long and short-term, by combining interdisciplinary, theoretical, and historical perspectives with cross-cultural knowledge and advanced language training.
- The student would be able to understand group dynamics and work in a team.

- The student would be able to apply the knowledge and skills learned to be a potential employee in an organization in need of his/her abilities.
- The student should be able to apply the holistic experience of learning in the practical world beset with problems

#### **10. METHODS OF EVALUATION AND PASSING CRITERIA( Standard Of Passing ) :**

1. Assessment shall consist of Continuous Internal Evaluation( CIE ) and End Semester Examination ( ESE )with an equal weightage of 50%.
2. The concerned teacher is responsible for conduct and evaluation towards CA and shall announce at the beginning of the course about the mechanisms under which CA would take place. However, the Semester End Examination ( SEE ) shall cover the entire syllabus prescribed for that course.
3. The CA towards 50% marks will be a continuous activity.
4. It is mandatory for a teacher to hand over the assessed answer sheets to the respective students well before the commencement of the Semester End Examination ( SEE ).
5. It is also mandatory to declare the score gained by all the students in a course towards CA on the notice board duly signed by the concerned teacher of the course and the HoD/Principal.
6. ESE for the remaining 50% marks will be conducted by the College.
7. A student will have to obtain a minimum aggregate of 40% marks in each course to be counted for the minimum number of credits required for the completion of the programme.
8. If a student misses an internal assessment examination, he/she will have a second chance in the same semester itself with the endorsement of the HoD/Principal in consultation with the concerned teacher. Such a second chance shall not be the right of the student.
9. A Student must obtain a minimum of 40% Marks in Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and minimum 40% marks in Semester End Examination.
10. It means Passing separately in Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination is compulsory.
11. In an exceptional case, if there are sufficient number of students who wish to register for a course for CA and Semester End Examination ( SEE ) both in which they are failed, then such a course can be conducted in the immediate following semester only, in addition to the courses conducted in that semester. However, there cannot be more than two such courses at a time in that semester.
12. The student will be finally declared as failed if the minimum numbers of credits are not earned within a total period of Four years for 2 years PG Program. After that, such a student will have to seek fresh admission as per the admission rules prevailing at that time.

#### **11. CONTINUOUS INTERNAL EVALUATION(CIE - Theory):**

- Each course of 4 credits will be evaluated in the form of 50 marks for CIE and 50 marks for End Semester Examination ( ESE ).

### **13. COMPLETION OF DEGREE :**

The class in respect of M.A. Examination will be awarded on the basis of aggregate marks obtained by the candidates in all the sixteen papers at the Semester I, II, III, and IV together.

### **14. A.T.K.T. RULES&GRADE IMPROVEMENT:**

1. If a student is declared as "PASS" in a course (Grade other than F), then the student cannot choose/reappear that course unless appearing under "CLASS/GRADE IMPROVEMENT" for Semester End Examination only.
2. CA is not available for a course in which the student has been declared as "PASS". If a student is declared as "FAIL" (Grade F) in a course, then the student is allowed to choose such a course with CIE and Semester End Examination ( SEE ) both only in a semester in which the course is conducted, irrespective of the previous score in CIE.

3. A student cannot register for the third / fourth semester, if she/he fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits expected to be ordinarily completed within one and two semesters.
4. Students who are failed in Semester End Examination of any odd semester can re-appear for the same only in the next odd semester and vice versa. Eg: students failed in 1<sup>st</sup> semester can reappear in 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester only and students failed in 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester can appear in 4<sup>th</sup> Semester only.

**15. VERIFICATION, MODERATION AND REVALUATION :**

1. There shall be a revaluation of the answer scripts of Semester End Examination ( SEE ) as per College Ordinance but not of CA.
2. There will be bar coding and masking of the answer sheets of Semester End Examination ( SEE ) prior to assessment. The examination panels will be finalized by the respective Board of Studies.
3. There will be moderation for all papers after the assessment by concerned subject teachers.
4. The rule for moderation will be: 14 – 19=100%, 20 – 29=5% on random basis and 30-50=100%.
5. If a moderator finds some problems with the assessment of a paper, the option to increase the number of papers moderated could be exercised in consultation with the Principal/CEO.
6. If 30% or more of the moderated papers assessed by a particular examiner of a subject have a change of more than 15% of total marks assigned to the paper, a blind moderation will be required by a second moderator. If the change is upheld, all the answer papers of that group will have to be re-evaluated blind by the second moderator. The re-evaluated marks will be the final score awarded.

**16. GRADING & STRUCTURE OF TRANSCRIPT :**

1. While marks will be given for all examinations, they will be converted into grades.
2. The Semester End Grade sheets will be generated by using marks and grades and the final grade sheets and transcripts shall have grade points average and total percentage of marks (up to two decimal points).
3. The final grade sheet will also indicate the PG Department/Center to which the candidate is registered.
4. At the end of each semester, student will be given a mark sheet showing the performance and result in each course.
5. The transcript shows, for each course the title of the course, credit values, grade in End Semester Examination, grade in Internal Assessment, Grade Point Index, result as Pass or Fail.
6. Also, the semester grade point average (SGPA) and cumulative grade point average (CPGA) will be shown in the result.

## **17. AWARD OF CLASS:**

The term grading system indicates a 10 – points scale of evaluation of the performance of students in terms of marks obtained in the Internal and Semester End Examination, grade points and letter grade. The total performance within a semester and continuous performance starting from the first semester are indicated respectively by Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). Candidates who pass all the examinations prescribed for the course in the first appearance itself alone are eligible for Ranking.

The 10-point scale would be used to convert marks out of 100 to grades and grade points according to the following table:
